AN ADVANCED SURGICAL PROCEDURE LEAVES PATIENT WITH A PAIN-FREE LIFE

A successful Para Thyroidectomy procedure to remove parathyroid gland.

r. Jawad Khadim Tweli from Iraq had been experiencing severe bone pain for a long time. After proper and thorough evaluation, it was found that he was suffering from Parathyroid Adenoma and had also developed kidney stones. Under the expert supervision of Dr. Archit Pandit, Director and HOD - Surgical Oncology, a team of well experienced surgical experts performed a successful and advanced procedure called Para Thyroidectomy to remove the parathyroid gland. Mr. Tweli had a swift recovery and was able to fly back to his home country completely recovered and without any pain.

Mr. Jawad Khadim Tweli met Dr. Archit Pandit at Sanar International Hospitals through a translator when he came to India. A team of Doctors thoroughly evaluated him through several tests and diagnosed him with Parathyroid Adenoma. He was recommended to undergo surgery to remove the Parathyroid gland. The surgery was performed meticulously and the tumour was removed along with three other lymph nodes, successfully.

The patient was happy that he had to stay in the Hospital for just one full-day for the complete treatment. He was quite appreciative of the services and infrastructure of the hospital. He particularly appreciated how compassionate the doctors and the caregivers were, and how they served the patients with humanity.

Dr. Archit Pandit stated, "Mr. Tweli returned to his home after couple of days of the surgery, and this was made possible due to the advanced techniques used in the surgery. Our surgeries are now done through small

incisions, and the patients can resume their routine work within two days. Most importantly, the whole team of surgical oncology, ICU, medical oncology, and anaesthesia collaborated together to send the patient back home post-surgery."

TIMELY DETECTION HELPED AVOID LIFE-THREATENING CONDITION

Tumour successfully removed with an advanced and minimally invasive treatment procedure.

61-year-old Ali Jaber from Iraq had been experiencing pain and burning sensation while urinating for quite some time. He was unaware that this condition was due to a tumour in his right kidney. At Sanar International Hospitals, his tumour was successfully removed with an advanced and minimally invasive treatment procedure.

Mr. Jaber said," I was in Iraq undergoing chemotherapy sessions, and this situation led me to India. I came to Sanar International Hospitals and met Dr. Sumit Sharma; after all the investigations it was found that my right kidney's functioning was only 17 %. I am very thankful to Dr. Sumit Sharma and the entire team of the Hospital for removing the infected part of the kidney successfully, I am now getting better with every passing day."

Dr. Sumit Sharma added, "Mr. Jaber underwent a successful laparoscopic removal of the right kidney, which is a key hole surgery. It involves minimal cut on the body, and the patient recovers in a painless manner. Subsequent to removal of the tumour completely from his body, the patient's symptoms have improved, which is apparent based on his feedback. The patient has now gone back to his country fully recovered and satisfied."

Brain Tumour: Symptoms, Signs, Diagnosis and Treatment

Brain Tumours are complex due to their diversity, as well as their effects on motor & cognitive function, and overall quality of life.

Brain Tumour

The extraordinary organ that controls our thoughts, emotions, and behaviour is the human brain. The delicate balance is upset when a tumour appears in this region, and the results can be life-altering. Brain tumours are abnormal growths that can form within the brain or spread from elsewhere in the body. They can be non-cancerous or cancerous, with varying implications on the brain depending on their size, location, and type. In this article, Dr. Harnarayan Singh, Director and HOD, Neurosurgery and Spine Surgery discusses brain tumour at length.

Signs and Symptoms

Recognising brain tumour signs and symptoms is crucial for early detection and intervention. While symptoms vary depending on the location of the tumour, some typical markers include persistent headaches, seizures, memory problems, mood or personality changes, difficulties with speech, coordination, and visual or hearing abnormalities. It is crucial to remember that these symptoms can potentially be related to other disorders, therefore seeking medical advice is critical for an accurate diagnosis.

Treatment and Diagnosis

A brain tumour is diagnosed using a variety of diagnostics, including neurological tests. Examinations, imaging scans (such as MRI or CT scans), and, in certain cases, a biopsy, are all performed. When a tumour is diagnosed, treatment options are decided by a number of criteria, including the type, size, and location of the tumour, as well as the individual's overall health.

Surgery, radiation therapy, and chemotherapy are all common treatment options for brain tumours. Surgery is intended to remove as much of the tumour as feasible, whilst radiation therapy and chemotherapy are intended to target any residual tumour cells. Precision radiation therapy and targeted medication therapies, for example, have greatly improved treatment outcomes and minimised side effects.

Research Challenges

Despite significant advancements, brain tumour research confronts various hurdles due to the tumour's complexity and heterogeneity. The development of effective medicines is hampered by the blood-brain barrier, or BBB which is a protective system that inhibits the flow of chemicals into the brain. Brain tumours have complex genetic and molecular characteristics that necessitate a thorough knowledge of personalised therapeutic methods.

New techniques, such as immunotherapy, are transforming cancer treatment by leveraging the immune system's ability to recognise and target tumour cells. Clinical studies investigating novel medicines are giving hope to individuals affected by brain tumours and presenting potential breakthroughs in the near future.

Living with a brain tumour is a difficult journey for not just the person who has been diagnosed, but also for the family and loved ones. Support groups, such as patient advocacy organisations, are a significant source of information, emotional support, and resources for navigating the intricacies of diagnosis, treatment, and survivorship. Individuals and families can be empowered by connecting with others who have had similar experiences, creating resilience and improving their quality of life.

Increased awareness, research, and education may continue to unravel the mysteries of brain tumours and foster hope for a future in which effective treatments and improved quality of life are available to all those affected.

Remember that managing the problems of brain tumours requires early discovery, prompt medical action, and continued support.


